Addressing the issue of: Finding a solution to the issue of Kurdish diaspora in relation to the fall of the Islamic state.

The Organisation of Islamic Cooperation,

Alarmed by the current tensions due to Kurdish diaspora,

Expressing its appreciation for the important role of Kurdish military forces in the ongoing battle against ISIL,

Taking into consideration the treaty of Sèvres,

Recognizing the need of actions in order to resolve social tensions between governments and people of Kurdish ethnicity,

Having considered that the implementation of an autonomous Kurdish region within Turkish territory would comply with the EU's request to settle the Turkish-Kurdish conflict,

1. Urges President Massoud Barzani and his followers to immediately cease their efforts of creating an independent Kurdish state and furthermore cooperate with local authorities in order to grant the functioning of the Iraqi Government, as it is crucial for international and national security and stability;
2. Strongly requests the Republic of Turkey, the Republic of Iran and the Republic of Syria to consider negotiations of granting autonomy to certain regions inhabited mainly by People of Kurdish ethnicity;
3. Calls upon all member states to further integrate people of Kurdish ethnicity into societies wherever possible;
4. Recommends the establishment of an Independent board funded by the international monetary fund to:
 - a. Assist and ease negotiations between nations and leaders of the respective Kurdish society,
 - b. Educate the Kurdish people and other ethnic groups about cultural differences in order to promote tolerance and mutual understanding such as but not limited to:
 - i. Writing informative papers upon the current issue,
 - ii. Elect an ambassador upon this topic for a period of 4 years;
5. Strongly deplores the violent acts coming from people of Kurdish ethnicity, as these acts are threatening national and global security as well as economic and social stability in affected regions;
6. Recommends that the Kurdish forces demilitarize to de-escalate the situation in order to integrate into society with more ease;
7. Encourages negotiations about border control surrounding a possible autonomous Kurdish territory;
8. Strongly urges Turkey to stop all bombing of Kurdish cities.
